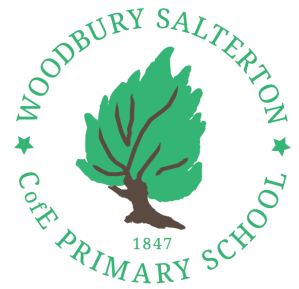

We're delighted that we've been awarded Silver Games Mark. The School Games Mark is an awards scheme which rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school. Ofsted also use the Mark award as part of their inspection framework.



As part of this award the school has:

- Provided more opportunities for those currently not engaged in competitive sport
- Provided access to a range of competition formats to offer new and exciting options for the children
- Maximised the impact of competitive school sport to develop young people's personal skills
- Offered opportunities for young people to develop leadership skills through volunteer roles such as officials and team managers

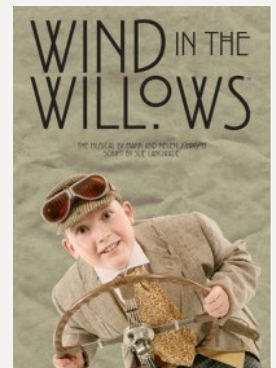
Goodbye & Thank You

Bronze Award Food for Life

We're delighted to have been awarded the bronze award for *Food for Life*. This award culminates more than a year's work around four areas of development, including Food Quality, Food Culture, Food Education and Food Leadership.



To achieve this award we:

- Have committed to improve our school food culture by developing a school food policy.
- Meet the Bronze Food for Life Catering Mark which shows that school food is healthy and uses seasonal ingredients that are at least 75% freshly prepared
- Involve pupils and parents in planning improvements to school menus and the lunchtime experience, boosting school meal take-up
- Give every pupil the opportunity to visit a local farm, and take part in cooking and food growing activity.

Well done to the whole team for this success, in particular Mrs Milford. School meals are important and we value your hard work in this area.

Free School Meal Claims - Year 3 from Sept 2016 - All pupils in R, Yr1 and Yr2 in state funded schools are eligible for a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM). You will therefore be aware that as students move into Year 3 (Sept 2016) they will lose their entitlement to UIFSM. If they wish to continue receiving a school meal they will either have to pay or apply for Free School Meals.
